<u>CEMETERY CLEAN UP OF FLOWERS</u>: Easter is April 9th. ALL CHRISTMAS ARRANGEMENTS / FLOWERS, and GRAVE DECORATIONS must be removed from all graves in the Zion, Ballentine, and Hornsby cemeteries by MARCH 26, 2023. Mowing operations are from April 15 – October 15, 2023. Cemetery policy, section 6 – E & F state: E – floral arrangement that interfere with mowing and trimming will be removed by the Cemetery Committee; F – statues, vigil lights, glass objects, and similar types of commemorative items are not permitted.

<u>CEMETERY CLEAN UP</u>: The Cemetery Committee will meet THURS-DAY, MARCH 30th, at 9:00 A.M. to conduct the spring cleanup.


BALLENTINE DEEDS: The Ballentine Cemetery is purchased deeded plots. The Cemetery Committee requires a copy of all deeded plots to be on record with the committee. This is necessary so the committee is assured of correct location of a plot when a burial is necessary. Some original owners have sold plots or given permission for others to be buried in their plots, and have not notified the cemetery committee. It will help the owner, and committee to have this information on file instead of waiting until a need arises. Family deeds may have passed down through the family, or possibly been recorded at the York County Clerk's Office. IT IS

<u>HEADSTONE/FOOTSTONE RESTORATION</u>: The Cemetery Committee has been trying for over 13 years to locate a company to realign and level some of the head and footstone markers that have settled over the years. We are negotiating with a company that sounds very promising to do the necessary work. We will keep you posted on the improvements.

<u>ZION'S UNMARKED GRAVES</u>: As we know, Zion celebrated its 200th anniversary October 2022. There are a few unmarked graves without permanent markers. Some have only the funeral home temporary markers. It is necessary that all graves are identified out of respect for the individuals and proper location is identified. Families needing assistance, please contact a committee member listed below to correct this issue.



<u>UPDATE HEADSTONES</u>: There are several headstones that a date of death needs to be engraved, including Betsy Hogg and Helen Montgomery. If the families need a company contact, please contact the cemetery committee.






