


Handbells Heading to Ocean City, Maryland

and has completed seven medium / large head stones. This is a slow process so as not to damage the stones. Each headstone must be disassembled and set aside. A concrete base is then poured and must cure before returning the headstone base and then the headstone. Special equipment has been purchased to safely complete each job.

Should families view a headstone sitting close by to their loved one's grave site, we are in the process of repairing that headstone, and it should be back in place as soon as possible. Note: while Adam was repairing one headstone, another small flat headstone was uncovered which was below that stone. The cemetery committee researched the newfound stone, and it was reset on the proper grave.

Please remember if a family is having a new headstone/footstone placed on a grave to contact a member of the Cemetery Committee to discuss the current policy and to assure it is installed correctly. Also, the cemetery operates only on donations and has no other income. Please consider any tax-deductible donations to assist in maintaining the cemetery. Checks can be directed to Carol Westcott, Cemetery Treasurer, when donations are made that do not go to the church.

VDOT delivered some large stones recently to the ditch by the cemetery to help prevent further erosion.

We want to thank Scott Hartman for taking on this project and speaking to the people at VDOT to inform them of the situation. As a result of his conversation, the work has been completed.








Blessings this Holy Lenten Season. As Spring approaches, the Finance Committee wanted to update you on Zion's financial status.

We closed out 2023 in a good financial position, even though giving to our Tithes and Offerings, as well as our Building Mortgage Account, were below pledged and budgeted amounts. However, throughout this past year, we adjusted expenditures and used some of our designated and campaign ac-

counts to accomplish the necessary large capital improvements to the boiler for heat in the sanctuary and to begin the work on our organ. The organ fundraising campaign generated \$80,000 which allowed us to contract for the modernization earlier than originally planned. These gifts are a blessing that will keep our organ, and sanctuary, operational for many decades to come.

Our 2023 focus on mission was a wonderful success. Designated and General giving allowed us to meet our budgeted operational expenses and grow our missions activities like PORT, Food Closet, and a host of Children's programs, including a very successful VBS. For 2024, we have three capital improvement projects on our "wish list", but we have put those on hold while we evaluate congregational giving and the need for fundraising campaigns. We want to maintain our growth in mission work before we execute big campus capital improvements.



What Is Your Blood Type?

Hi, Everyone! I pray this newsletter reaches you in good health and spirit.

I want to address an important health issue, our blood types. Where can you get your blood typed? You can give blood during the Red Cross Blood Drives or ask your Primary Care Provider to type test your blood or by doing the blood type kit at home. Testing by the Red Cross is free. You will receive a donor card with your blood type on it. Blood type testing at your doctor's office will be covered by health insurance provided it is

medically necessary or if one is pregnant. Home test kits are not covered by health insurances as the kit is considered "out of pocket" expense.

Why would you need to know your blood type? For Example, should there be a certain type blood crisis in the community, you would know that your blood is greatly needed.

Type "O negative" blood is considered the "universal donor". Unfortunately, people with type O negative can only be transfused with type O negative blood. Type O+can be used universally for A+, B+, O+, and AB+, this with O+ blood can only receive transfusions from O+ or O- blood types.

Why can't the type A or B be universal donors, you ask? As each person has inherited their blood type from their parents, it may not be compatible with other blood types. The Rh factor is also taken into consideration whether the receiver of the transfusion is compatible with the donor's Rh factor.

What is the Rh factor? This is a protein on the surface of the red blood cells and is known as the "Rh Factor". When an Rh+ blood transfusion is introduced to a Rh-blood, that person's immune system produces antibodies to attack and destroy the "foreign blood cells" and causing great harm to the recipient.

Regardless of your blood type, please consider donating blood as a love offering to our community. It is always needed for different reasons and it's home is at the blood bank.


