



<u>The Cemetery Committee</u> would like to give an update to our project on the repairs of many of the head/foot stones at the cemetery. As a reminder, the cemetery is actually made up of four individual sections.

- 1. Zion Cemetery open to all members of Zion Church that meet certain criteria.
- 2. Ballentine Cemetery adjacent to Zion Cemetery, individual plots are owned by families.
- 3. Hornsby Section used for cremations and individual family markers.
- 4. Memorial Garden located next to the church and parsonage where individual cremations are laid to rest and family markers are installed on a nearby plaque.

The Cemetery Committee has complete control of the maintenance and up keep of all four cemeteries. Currently at the Zion and Ballentine Cemeteries, approximately 25 head/foot stones have been restored by placing concrete foundations under the stones. Some of the stones were sinking into the ground below the inscription dates, or unleveled. These stones had been placed before regulations were added that required con-

crete footings. We have a list of approximately 90 stones that are in need of repair. We will continue to work on this project for several years until all stones are completed. It takes special care to repair some of the stones. We are very fortunate to have Adam Swale as our contractor. This is an expense that is being incurred by the committee. The only income the committee has is through donations of families and friends with relatives buried at the cemetery. Donations can be made directly to the Cemetery Committee, or when a member dies, memorial gifts are accepted. I want to thank the 35 members of the congregation who came out for our Ministry, Missions, and Finances meeting in July. It was a great opportunity to discuss the mission of our church, the many missions we are committed to, and to discuss our current financial status. We are the church, and in order for us to remain active in all aspects of ministry, we need to live into our mission and our financial commitments.

Now that we are experiencing cooler days and lower humidity, it means.....it's Budget time. Your finance committee has begun the annual process of reviewing our fi-

nances and preparing next year's budget. We are building a leaner 2025 budget, which will maintain our focus on mission, but align with the realities of reduced giving. We are continuing to delay capital expenditures and are reducing fixed expenses where we can.

The Virginia Conference leadership recognizes the reduction in giving Conferencewide and have also cut apportionments accordingly. You should have received your 2025 pledge cards in the mail. Please prayerfully consider increasing your giving where you feel called. 
