
We are now entering into a new season of celebrations! While we are in the midst of the 50-day Easter Season as a church, where we celebrate our


EggFest'25 Offered Great Celebration For All

NEWS FROM CHURCH FINANCES



Spring is in the air. The flowers are in full bloom and the Spirit is strong. We proclaimed God is Great as we celebrated our Risen Lord with a wonderful Easter weekend full of activities. Seeing families visiting Zion for EggFest on Saturday, April 19, and the people packing the pews on Easter Sunday, we are reminded of His presence in our lives. This reminds me of what is stated in the UMC *Book of Discipline*, "We emphasize the nurturing and serving function of Christian fellowship in the Church. Our Faith and tradition not only promote personal growth, they also equip and motivate us for mission and service to the world".

For a church to continue to grow and serve, we must have a strong financial foundation. Recently, we have been focused on the operational portion of Zion's budget. Unfortunately, we finished 2024 with a negative balance in our Operating Account. Since this account pays to "keep the lights on", we took action to fund the Operating Account by moving money from investment accounts and other designated accounts. We also encouraged our generous congregation to focus their giving on the Operating Account, while we implemented a freeze on all non-emergency spending, and we continued the freeze on Capital Projects.

Blessedly, these actions are helping, but we are not "out of the woods yet" but through faith and commitment, we are making great progress. We would like to challenge you to increase your gifts to the Operations Account by \$5 dollars per week. If 100 givers add \$5 to their weekly gift, it will generate over \$25,000 in just 12 months. If you can give more, praise the Lord! If 100 givers added \$10 per week it would generate over \$50,000 in a year.

If you would like more information about the finances of the church, please contact anyone on the Finance Committee. Over \$500 was raised at the event for future projects.




OUR HAND BELL CHOIR ATTENDS BELL FESTIVAL


