you must have pondered. "Did I miss it?" "Did someone forget to deliver it to me?" or maybe even, "Why is





### The 243rd Session of the Virginia Annual Conference


On Wednesday, June 11, at 7:00 am, Pastor David and I hit the road to Roanoke! When we arrived in the afternoon we headed straight to registration. Pastor David headed off to the clergy session and I jumped right in to help to register other laity members (several volunteers had not shown up). The laity session this year was held virtually and focused on the importance and the roll of lay ministers. It was emphasized that all of us who roll up our sleeves, get involved, and do the work of the church are considered lay ministers. If, however,

someone desires to be a Certified Lay Minister, then additional training is available to become certified. If interested, please contact the church office.

On Thursday morning we began with Bishop Sue leading us in worship. The Annual Conference Summary sums it up much better than I can, saying: "Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson brought the morning message on Ezra. She shared the historical perspective on the number of Israelites who came back, only around 10% returned. Bishop shared the hard time that we have been through recently, especially since January and reiterated that this is not a political message, but a message of hope that we will all be in prayer for guidance. Bishop Sue shared about the nostalgia that many of us feel for the days when the church was bigger and more active, but also not very diverse. That diversity is not always comfortable for people. As we look at the future of the church, we stand with people that others want to give up on. Bishop Sue said she will stand with any-



one who is marginalized and being used as a political pawn."






On Friday afternoon there were four constitutional amendments that were voted on. These are amendments that came from the 2020/2024 General Conference regarding Regionalization. We will not know the outcome of this vote until all Annual Conferences have voted. They require a 2/3's vote from all voting members of all Annual Conferences collectively.

Saturday morning Bishop Ken Carter led the Service of Call & Ordination. After that we hopped on the road and headed back to Seaford. I enjoyed my time in Roanoke, representing my church, there have been some changes to Annual Conference, some I enjoyed, and some not so much. But I look forward to seeing what AC2026 holds in Harrisonburg.






# YOUTH BOWLING NIGHT






